ADMISSION CRITERIA

The criteria listed below are the general criteria required for admission to an honours programme in the Faculty of Science and Agriculture. Applicants need to consult the faculty prospectus to ensure that they meet the specific requirements of the Honours programme they are applying for.

Students with foreign qualifications are required to evaluate such qualifications with the appropriate South African Qualification Authority (SAQA) prior to making application for admission to the University. Equivalency certificates from SAQA need to be submitted at the time of application.

HONOURS QUALIFICATIONS

Bachelor of Agriculture (Honours):

A person shall not be registered as a candidate for the degree unless s/he holds the degree of Bachelor of Agriculture of the University or has been admitted to the status thereof. A candidate shall not be admitted to any module for the Honours degree unless s/he has obtained the permission of the Faculty Post-graduate admissions committee.

Normally candidates will not be admitted to the Honours programme unless they have obtained at least 60% in the final year in the subject in which they wish to register for Honours.

For admission to the Agricultural Economics option, a candidate must hold the Bachelor of Agriculture (Agricultural Economics) degree of the University or have been admitted to the status thereof. By special permission of Senate, on recommendation of the Board, a holder of another bachelor's degree may be admitted.

A student may be required to make up such deficiencies as deemed necessary by the Head of Department.

Bachelor of Science (Honours):

A learner shall be admitted to the Honours programme in a subject only with the permission of the relevant Head of Department. Normally a learner will be admitted to an Honours programme in a subject in which an average mark of 60% in all the modules required of the particular subject was obtained in the final undergraduate year.

MASTERS QUALIFICATIONS

Master of Agriculture or Master of Science in Agriculture

A learner shall be admitted to the Masters' degree in a subject only with the permission of the Faculty Post-graduate admissions committee.
